

Famously known as the 'Garden of England', Kent also has some of the UK's wine top producers with many wines punching above their weight in national and international markets and winning medals in their class.

We have selected a number of excellent examples of Kentish wines for your enjoyment. All of these wines are exclusively estate grown and produced and reflect the unique characteristics of the Kentish terrior. Standard 750ml bottle and selected wines by 175ml and 250ml glass size.

~ White ~

Biddenden Ortega 2016 (Müller-Thurgau/Siegerrebe Cross) - bottle £27.00 - 175ml £6.75 - 250ml £10.00

Off-dry semi-aromatic on the nose, displays appealing fresh aromas of green apple, grapefruit, cut grass and flora, whilst the palate is medium bodied, crisp, characterful and deliciously fruity.

Biddeneden Bridge Ortega 2017 • bottle £27.00

A lovely nose of soft apple blossom and gentle apricot. The palate is off-dry but deliciously fresh and easy to get along with. The apricot follows on from the nose and is combined with rounded citrus fruits - mainly subtle orange and lemon.

Chapel Down Bacchus 2017 (Silvaner/Riesling cross with Müller-Thurgau) • bottle £34.00

A crisp, refreshing highly aromatic wine displaying gooseberry and elderflower on the nose. The palate is fresh and zesty with flavours of nettle, kiwi and freshly cut grass leading to a crisp, dry finish.

Simpsons Derringstone Pinot Meunier 2018 - bottle £36.00

Displays chalk purity and sweet and savoury aromas of poached winter fruit. Complex balsamic nuances and red fruit flavours finish with a deliciously creamy mouth-feel.

Simpsons Roman Road Chardonnay 2017 - bottle £37.00 - 175ml £10.00 - 250ml £14.00

Displays aromas of white peach and lime, with clean, citrus flavours, smooth cashew nut on the palate and subtle hints of spice and vanilla.

Kits Coty Estate Bacchus 2017 - bottle £45.00 - 175ml £11.50 - 250ml £16.00

This wine has recently been awarded a Decanter World Wines Platinum Trophy. Subtle oak scent gives creamy, Fumé Blanc-esque aromas. Combines cream, citrus, dairy and spice really well. Lovely complexity and depth, with great acidity and nectarine fruit, well balanced and integrated.

~ Rosé ~

Simpsons Railway Hill Rosé (Pinot Noir) - bottle £36.00

A beautiful Provencal-style English rosé. The rosé has fresh aromas of grapefruit, lime and lychee and displays clean stone fruits flavours balanced by a crisp mouth-watering finish which captures the essence of summer.

~ Red ~

Biddenden Gribble Bridge Dornfelder 2018 • bottle £27 • 175ml £6.75 • 250ml £10.00

A taste of fresh raspberries and summer fruits abound in this refreshing, light red wine. Can be served slightly chilled.

~ Sparkling ~

Simpsons Canterbury Rose Rosé 2016 (Pinot Noir) - bottle £45.00

With smooth hues of rose petal and strawberry sorbet, this rosé delivers a refined, crisp and creamy finish (last bottle remaining).

Biddenden Gribble Bridge Sparkling Rosé 2014 (Gamay) - bottle £46.00

An off-dry sparkling rosé with blushing damask rose tones. The taste is of sweet summer fruit - think strawberry, rasp-berry and pear, with a half-squeeze of lemon.

Simpsons Chalklands Classic Cuvée 2016 (Chardonnay and Pinot Noir) • bottle £49.00

Pale gold in colour, it has an enticing caramelised pear and floral millefeuille pastry nose with bright citrus flavours, linear precision and impressive length.
